
Quick Poll Results

Quick Poll Results: How Often--and How-- Do You Treat Bruxism?

Most dentists see one to three patients per month for bruxism, a condition in which patients grind or clench their teeth, our October 2015 Quick Poll of 400 respondents found. There's no cure for bruxism; practitioners focus on managing symptoms and preventing complications. Almost all of the poll respondents said they fit their bruxism patients with occlusal guards, also known as night guards. Other common treatments are illustrated below.
