

How Dentists Are Closing Open Bites

For adult patients with anterior open bite (AOB), most-95%-of orthodontists frequently used fixed orthodontic appliances, which are bonded or cemented to the teeth, a study of 347 patients and 91 practitioners found. Most-88%-also used elastics frequently. AOB is defined as the absence of vertical overlap of the anterior teeth. The study was published in the November 2018 The Angle Orthodontist.

Practitioners used other approaches less frequently, though still occasionally, for AOB:

- Between 10% and 13% frequently recommended orthognathic (jaw) surgery, and between 77% and 80% did so occasionally.
- One third of practitioners reported using clear aligners (braces) frequently, and about half recommended them occasionally.
- Only 12% frequently used temporary anchorage devices (TADs), which are small implants, and 62% used them occasionally.
- While 28% of practitioners frequently recommended an extraction, 65% did so occasionally. <u>Read more...</u>




Quick Poll Results

Quick Poll Results: Dental Treatment During Pregnancy

Our September Quick Poll found that some Network members won't provide certain treatments to pregnant women that prenatal oral health care guidelines approve. Being pregnant puts a woman at a higher risk for gum disease and dental cavities. In the United States, more than 40% of pregnant women don't see a dentist.

Of the 526 poll respondents, about three-fourths said they would do a comprehensive oral health exam during pregnancy. However, less than half said they would routinely provide emergency treatment to pregnant women, including extractions and other invasive procedures. Some practitioners said they require medical clearance from the patient's doctor. <u>Read more...</u>
