

Can you trust the results from your diagnostic tests assessing pulp vitality?

Response to cold and pain on percussion are common ways to see if the pulp of a tooth and surrounding supporting tissues are affected by disease. However, the validity of these approaches for identifying the vitality of pulp hasn't been demonstrated in regular dental practice, the environment where the vast majority of dental care is provided. A study in the Journal of Endodontics finds that the results from cold testing teeth is as good as previous studies conducted using standardized methodology and a limited number of trained examiners.
