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[Developmental Defects of Enamel](#)

Developmental defects of enamel (DDE) are visible deviations from the normal translucent appearance of tooth enamel resulting from damage to the enamel organ. Clinically, DDE can be classified into three types: demarcated opacity, diffuse opacity and hypomineralization. These defects result from genetic and/or environmental factors and are known to be associated with higher incidences of caries.
